### PREPARE TO GREET THE SAVIOR

From Pastor

Dear Christian People,

Arise! Prepare yourselves today; Prepare to greet the Savior, Who takes your sins away.

During the Church's season of Advent, we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ our Savior. Contrary to what our culture says, it's not the Christmas season until Christmas. The decoration of our homes, church, and buildings with lights shines the brightness of hope in the dreary darkness of the long nights of December. Christians decorate as with holy vigil looking forward to that most holy night of our Lord's Advent among us.

As we decorate our homes, we also decorate ourselves. More than Christmas "ugly sweaters" or our finest Christmas church clothes, we dress our hearts, our minds, our very being in focus toward Christmas. Jesus, the Son of God is coming! Be ready to meet Him! Be ready in repentance, bearing the fruits of repentance. Restrain yourselves from sin. Seek reconciliation where there is none. Live in peace. Keep God's name holy as children of God, leading holy lives according to His Word. See your life, as God sees it, and as He desires His holy children to live—differently than those of the world—and make preparations accordingly.

Three of the four Collects for Advent are about preparing by stirring up and taking action. Our desire is for our Lord to come and rescue us from our sins and lift them from us. We also pray that we are prepared for His coming, serving Him with pure minds (help us to do this, dear Father in heaven). Celebrating the birth of Jesus also teaches us to look forward to His 2<sup>nd</sup> coming. Our annual celebration of His first coming in Bethlehem makes us aware and keeps before us the truth that He will come again, for the last and final time. Before that time, He stirs up His power and comes among us in Word and Sacrament to rescue and forgive our sin, and we, by these holy Means, also prepare for His appearing. At His 2<sup>nd</sup> Advent, He will bring into Paradise all who are prepared in repentance and faith in Christ our Savior. All our preparations will finally come to the joy of completion and we will see our Savior face to face!

Arise, O Christians people! Prepare yourselves today; Prepare to greet the Savior, Who takes your sins away! (LSB 354 v1)

Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come, that by Your protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins and saved by Your mighty deliverance. (Advent 1)

Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to make ready the way of Your only-begotten Son, that by His coming we may be enabled to serve You with pure minds. (Advent 2)

Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come and help us by Your might, that the sins which weigh us down may be quickly lifted by Your grace and mercy. (Advent 4)




