LENTEN ENCOURAGEMENT

From Pastor

Dear Saints,

Beginning Ash Wednesday (February 18th this year), Lent is a 40-day period in the Church of penitential preparation for Easter. The number of days mirror Jesus' time in the wilderness, when He was tempted by the devil, fasted, and prayed.

Each year on Ash Wednesday, the liturgy of the Church calls us to begin "a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection," when "our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The words used in the Ash Wednesday rite of the Lutheran Service Book Agenda also remind us that "from ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope."

Lent is a challenge for Christians (at least, it should be). We make ourselves feel and realize our need for Holy Week, Good Friday, and Easter - our Savior's passion, suffering death, and resurrection. While our world overlooks these, we glory in them. While our world is busied and distracted by the ease of life, fleeting images, and sinful pleasures, we avert our eyes, guard our hearts and minds, and focus every more on conforming our lives to Christ.

An historical practice of Lent is to "give-up" something during the season to feel a personal lack and suffer a little with Jesus. Fasting, totally or in some form, is the traditional Lenten practice of this. Suffering can and does teach.

Another practice of Lent is adding times of prayer and meditation in the church. On Wednesdays in Lent, we add a meal at 5pm and a service at 7pm for your prayer, meditation, and growth. While restraint and self-denial are part of Lent, so also is adding and giving greater effort to pious practices. It does take extra effort for prayer and meditation when temptations, distractions, and the noise of the world vie for your attention. Lent brings us opportunity to grow in faith and life. Make a

greater effort to pray more during Lent (there are numerous prayers in the front of our hymnal, Lutheran Service Book, to aid personal prayer). Make a greater effort to read the Bible (find a reading plan or select a couple books of the Bible to read through). Read and study the Small or Large Catechism or another good theological book (I can share some suggestions). Attend the services in the church. Reflect on your daily life and grow in your Baptism and the image of Christ in the example you show others as a Christian. Lent ends with Easter, and life ends in resurrection.

But, above all, heed the encouragement of Lent from Joel 2, "Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.

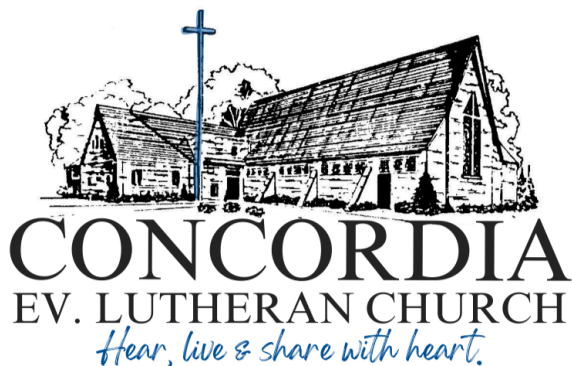
